The Film Industry in Georgia



Lee Thomas is a Deputy Commissioner at the Georgia Department of Economic Development, and division director of the Georgia Film, Music & Digital Entertainment Office. A native Atlantan, Lee received a Bachelor of the Arts in Radio -TV -Film from UGA, a Master's Degree in Film Studies from Georgia State University, then entered the Tisch School of the Arts Doctoral Program in Cinema Studies at New York University. She returned to Atlanta in 1996 to work for the Georgia Film and Videotape Office as a project manager, and then became a location specialist for the office in 1998. After finding locations for film and television projects for 12 years, Lee became director of the film division in 2010.

We have a famous and popular speaker coming to speak to our club on Friday, January 12, J. TOM MORGAN. You might want to consider bringing your spouses and friends to hear him because he is coming to Atlanta just to speak to our club! J. Tom is recognized on three fronts: as an exemplary trial attorney in private practice, as a distinguished District Attorney for DeKalb County for 12 years, and as a nationally recognized advocate for children.

J. Tom will devote his talk primarily on the prosecution of crimes against children. He was the first prosecutor in Georgia to specialize in the prosecution of crimes against children, and he has appeared on The Oprah Winfrey Show, The Today Show, CNN's Talk Back Live, Court TV, and 48 Hours. He has lectured to prosecutors and law enforcement officials in more than 30 states, Puerto Rico and Europe. J. Tom has authored articles on child abuse and was instrumental in drafting and lobbying for laws that provide more protection for children in child abuse cases.

He has also committed to educating young people and helping them avoid being both victims and perpetrators of crimes. He is the author of *Ignorance Is No Defense, A Teenage's Guide to Georgia Law*, now in its fourth edition, which explains over 100 laws in Georgia that impact Georgia teens.

Rotary Leadership Institute: The next RLI opportunity will be in Thomasville Georgia on **1/20/2018** at Southern Regional College. Parts 1,2,3 will be offered, as well as a new Grad Course in Membership for those who have completed Part 3. The next opportunity after that to attend RLI sessions will be a little closer to home. It will be held on March 10th at Tucker Middle School (26 Idlewood Toad, Tucker, GA 30084). Registration is \$100 per course.
