Midwest Food Bank in Georgia

Thursday's program was presented by Will Garner, the Executive Director of the Midwest Food Bank (MFB), Georgia Division. Garner spent 26 years in active duty with the U.S. Army, retiring with the rank of Colonel. In September 2013, he assumed leadership of the Georgia Division of the Midwest Food Bank, headquartered in Peachtree City. The obvious question is why there is a Georgia Division of the Midwest Food Bank. started on the Kieser family farm in Bloomington, IL in 2003 when the Kieser family began providing food out of a machine shed on their family farm. MFB began by serving about 10 food pantries in McLean County, IL. What began as a family ministry, evolved into a ministry serving over 1,100 organizations across the Midwest and the Southeast. Their reputation drew volunteers, financial gifts, and corporate sponsors. needing food reached out for assistance, and expansion

of the ministry required expanding the ministry beyond the originating family. The food given out each month now reaches nearly one million people; all given without any charge to the recipients. David Kieser, President, CEO, and co-founder of MFB, captures the vision of this ministry in these words, "Our hope is to help bridge the gap between prosperity and poverty in our community." In 2015, MFB provided 315,000 cases of food with a retail value of over \$10 million. At present, they serve 263 nonprofit organizations with food over 5 states and 43 counties. Soon, they will be opening a distribution center in Arizona. After the devastating aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, they also became involved in disaster relief. In total, they delivered 150 semis of food into the area and began an important partnership with the Salvation Army. Their present needs are: support for operations, funding to finish the loading dock in Peachtree City, finding regional food sources, and enlisting volunteer semi-truck drivers for distribution of food. They are in the top 1% of charities in the United States according to Charity Navigator, and their record shows that 99.2% of all donations go to support those in need.
