## **General Information**

- 1. Conference registration and room registration links are active and linked to the district website. Conference registration will close at midnight on **Monday, April 22, 2019.**
- 2. Please be sure to book your hotel rooms as soon as possible to guarantee availability. Hotel reservations are the responsibility of the registrant. Reservations must be made on or before the cut-off date of **Saturday, March 16, 2019** in order to be eligible for the group rate. To make hotel reservations, please go to the Rotary District 6900 website and click on room registrations which links you directly to the Grand Sandestin Hotel. Our Rotarians are strongly encouraged to register within our Sandestin room block. Booking outside the block may result in higher fees for future conferences.
- 3. A special conference registration rate of \$240 will be in effective until January 15, 2019. The rate increases to **\$260 on January 16, 2019 and \$290 on March 16, 2019**.

- 14. For clubs that host GRSP students, their registration fee includes food and hotel room for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Please note their fee does include accommodations for Thursday, but there is limited space. For students who plan to arrive on Thursday, you must coordinate with George Siggins. The students must be in Sandestin by Friday at 1:00 CST. Their activities include the following: (a) GRSP Parade of Flags rehearsal on Friday from 2:00 pm–3:00 pm and (b) GRSP Parade of Flags presentation, on Friday

night. On Friday night, the GRSP students will assemble in the Pit Crew Lounge beginning at 6:20pm.

- 15. If your club is one of the clubs sponsoring a "hospitality suite" on the third floor of the Grand Sandestin Hotel, please prepare a sign (18x24) with your club's name on it. Please display the sign outside your door.

"Children's Evening Out" with dinner, movies, and activities is offered from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m., for \$65 per child.
