


Today's Speaker: Jack Barsky

Jack Barsky's life marks him as one of a kind. He was born in Germany, became a chemistry professor, was recruited by the KGB, spent 10 years in the United States spying for the Russians, and ended up a United States citizen and information technology executive.

Jack's story was featured in May of 2015 on CBS 60 Minutes. His memoir "Deep Undercover" was released in March of 2017. The book has been translated into German, Swedish and Polish. Jack has appeared frequently on US cable stations such as CNN, FOX and MSNBC as well as on foreign TV including such countries as Germany, Poland, Japan, Turkey and France. In his 6th career as a public speaker Jack has had appearances across the United States as well as in Germany, Ireland and Poland. His book has been optioned to produce a TV series under the working title "An American Citizen". Jack lives with his wife Shawna and daughter Trinity in Atlanta Georgia.

Judge **Adele Grubbs** introduced the guest speaker, Dr. Roger Tutterow, Professor of Economics from Kennesaw State University. Dr. Tutterow also serves as Director of the Econometric Center, an applied research center affiliated with KSU's Cole's College of Business. Dr. Tutterow holds a B.S. in Decision Science from Berry College, and an M.A. and Ph.D. from Georgia State University. He also serves as a consultant on financial economics and statistical modeling for many Fortune 500 companies.

Dr. Tutterow opened with an optimistic explanation of where we are nationally. Despite naysayers, the American economy is still growing and will grow the remainder of the year he predicts. The economy has been growing for 119 consecutive months. That is the good news. However, this long expansion causes people to say we are due for a recession. What does that mean? He does not believe in a classic business cycle. We don't have to have recessions. They are due

to poor decision making. The economy currently has a lot of momentum. GDP growth is 3.2% as of last week. Since GDP measures what we produce not what we sell that declaration needs to be taken with a grain of salt. Manufacturing is a hot bed in Cobb County and is very important to the local economy. Manufacturing is very energy intensive. Affordable energy brings back production. Manufacturing jobs are coming back to Cobb and to the U.S. Dr. Tutterow is a pro free trade economist. He predicts that if a 10% tariff is put in place, it will offset the rise in interest rates. Consumer confidence is good. The naysayers are wrong. In April the economy was still adding jobs. He further advises to never look at one month's data and extrapolate over ten years. One month's data does not make a trend. We are adding 100,000 jobs per month. The State of Georgia is doing particularly well. Georgia is adding jobs faster than the rest of the U.S. There is preliminary evidence that millennials are leaving the basement and getting jobs. This is great news for the labor force. As millennials go to work, the labor shortage will be eliminated.

Despite interest rate complaints, we are currently in a low interest rate environment. Bankers are still looking for good customers. It is an excellent time to obtain long-term financing. The housing market is doing well especially in Cobb County. On the tax side, potential taxes and spending by the Democratic House does not bode well. As a nation we run a trade deficit. Sen. Purdue is trying to get relief for farmers. Dr. Tutterow professes not to understand the President on occasion, but the good results cannot be ignored. He closed by answering questions from the audience.

For the first time, the dining room was full to capacity.

The dish formulated today was Chicken Pot Pie with Biscuit Topping, a long-time favorite recipe provided by Chef **Harold Hobbs** before departing for a long-overdue beach vacation. The ingredients involved were nine ½ gallon cans of cooked chicken breasts, 98 oz. of frozen mixed vegetables, 6 quarts of chicken broth seasoned with minced onions, thyme, garlic powder, and a gravy created with flour and milk. The six trays were then topped with 98 biscuits, and all baked in the ovens
