

Kim Menefee is the executive director for the Cumberland Community Improvement District (CID). Kim brings more than 25 years of experience in senior marketing, communications, public/government affairs and community engagement to the position.

Prior to joining the CID, Kim served as WellStar Health System's senior vice president of Public/Government Affairs. She led the team that created the WellStar brand in addition to developing the organization's government relations role building strong relationships at the local, state and federal levels. Most recently, she served as senior vice president of Strategic Community Development where she was responsible for developing WellStar's strategic direction and alignment of community engagement and sponsorship with philanthropy efforts through the WellStar Foundation. Prior to joining WellStar, Kim worked as the Director of Marketing for Childress Klein Properties.

Kim has long been heavily involved in metro Atlanta and Cobb County holding various leadership positions on not-for-profit boards. Bert Reeves introduced our speaker, Scott Hilton, Executive Director of the Georgians First Commission. Scott is a graduate

of Georgetown University and received his MBA from Emory. He previously served as a member of the Georgia House of Representatives and worked in commercial banking.

The Georgians First Commission was created by the first executive order issued by Governor Kemp. The purpose of the commission is to: (1) review state regulations, policies, and procedures in order to streamline state government; (2) remove inefficiencies; and (3) secure Georgia's place as the top state for small business in the country. The commission is particularly focused on aiding small business in the navigation of the legal and regulatory maze which has been created over the years. Interestingly, Georgia defines a small business as having 350 employees or less. This is much larger than most states' definitions.

The commission currently consists of several task forces focused on the following issues:

- · Customer Experience / Regulatory Framework
- Occupational Licensing / Permitting Reform
- · State Procurement for Small Business
- Innovation Bloc
- Tax Reform / Competitiveness
- · Access to Capital
- Minority Owned Business
- · Rural Small Business Development
- Industry-Focused:
 - -Technology
 - -Healthcare
 - -Trucking / Transportation
 - -Restaurant / Food Service
 - -Agri-business / Agri-tech
- Economic Development for Small Business

Following Scott's prepared remarks, he opened the floor to questions and comments. Numerous club members spoke of difficulties they or their businesses or organizations had when dealing with government red tape.

The opportunity drawing was administered by Marlys Williams and Kelly Maxwell. When it turned out that Kelly's ticket had been selected by our speaker, she turned the bag over to Mary Ansley Southerland who vigorously shook the bag to insure fairness and "no collusion." Guy Lombardo leads my favorite band. His music, though of the popular type, is restful and inspiring.


Good salesmanship is a real boon to the shopper. It is such a pleasure to deal with one who has enthusiasm for his wares and my interest at heart.
