When Jim was President of the Sandy Springs Club they won the Category II Best Club award and he earned the Sheffield Leadership Award, our District's highest leadership award. He has been club Rotarian of the Year, earned two Service Above Self Awards, and proudly sponsored twelve new Rotary Club members.

Jim also contributes generously: he is a Major Donor, Paul Harris Society member and Bequest Society member with the Rotary Foundation and a Will Watt Fellow with the Georgia Rotary Student Program.

Professionally, Jim owns Franchise Marketing Advisors, a franchise consulting practice. A Certified Franchise

Executive, Jim has enjoyed a long career in franchising with many notable brands. • Mark Barbour reminded all that the "Bring the Heat Cook Off – Red, White & Boots" event hosted by The Georgia National Guard Family Support Foundation will be at the Jim R. Miller Pavilion Thursday, November 14, 2019 from 4:30 pm – 9:00 pm. Last year over \$30,000 was raised and this year's goal is \$70,000. In observance of 9-11, Dr. **Jim Speed** spoke and opined there should be four takeaways from the tragic event, a series of four coordinated terrorist attacks by the Islamic terrorist group al-Qaeda against the United States on the morning of Tuesday, September 11, 2001: (1) Remember what we read and saw (2) We need to continually say thank you to all first responders, they keep us safe (3) You must keep your head when you are being hated and doubted. Don't allow events to make us haters. It is love not hate that keeps the world afloat. All haters eventually hate each other and then themselves (4) Remember, the U.S. Congressmen on the Capitol steps singing "God Bless America" (including Senator Johnny Isakson). Lift us to love not hate, truly words of wisdom spoken from the heart.

The Hilton Hotel is unable to accommodate the club for the meeting scheduled October 9. Hence, Mark Barbour immediately suggested that all should plan to go to **Chief Flynn's** house. Once the laughter subsided; however, President Chris announced there are plans for an offsite meeting to serve a BBQ lunch to first responders at the Marietta Fire Department. Details are forthcoming.

Sunshine for this week's meeting were from Mark Barbour who asked for support for District Governor, **Jim Squire**, who will speak to the club on September 18, 2019. Jim Speed announced his melanoma has cleared, and his recent surgery was successful. Past President **Bill Dunaway** who has been a Marietta Rotarian for 55 years, respectfully suggested the club focus on scheduling meetings, and not look for reasons to cancel meetings, adding that he was not applying for the Henry Hill Award.



KIM MENEFEE

Mary Ansley Southerland introduced the speaker, Kim Menefee, Executive Director of the Cumberland Community Improvement District. She has been in this position at Cumberland CID for four months. Kim was at WellStar previously and served as Senior Vice President of Public/Government Affairs. She led the team that created the WellStar brand and was responsible for developing the strategic direction and alignment of community engagement and sponsorship through the WellStar Foundation. She brings more than 25 years of experience in senior marketing. communication, public/government affairs, and community engagement to the position. Additionally she is also a firsttime grandmother. Through Kim's presentation we learned that the Cumberland CID represents 5% of Georgia's economy. By 2024, businesses will have invested over \$180 million to grow the Cumberland area. There are 190 commercial investors who have provided funds to build infrastructure and transportation projects. The Braves relocation was significant to the area. Primary investors are Home Depot, the Braves, Genuine Parts, HD Supply, the Atlanta Opera & Ballet, and recently ThyssenKrupp.

ThyssenKrupp is a German multinational conglomerate with focus on industrial engineering and steel production. In addition to steel production, Thyssenkrupp's products range from machines and industrial services to high-speed trains, elevators and shipbuilding. They are erecting a 420 foot innovation lab which will create 900 new jobs.

Seventeen thousand residents live in the Cumberland area, and 100,000 commuters travel to Cumberland every day. There are 800 acres of national park including walking trails at the Chattahoochee River National Recreation area, and plans to connect trails from Kennesaw Mountain to the river. There is a bike share program at Paces Palisades Park and five other locations where bikes can be rented using a phone app.

Cumberland CID also maintains all the landscaping in the area. They do cleaning along I-285 and I-85. CID is responsible for the Akers Mill Ramp project creating express lanes which opened one year ago. These lanes save travelers one hour in the mornings, and up to 1 ½ hours commute in the evening. By 2023 Akers Mill Ramp will connect the NW Corridor express lanes providing safe access for more than 100,000 people traveling to and from Cumberland.

Kim remained to answer questions from the audience. In appreciation for Kim's visit, President Chris presented a book to be donated in her name to a Marietta school entitled "The Adventures of Fancy Nancy."
