Dr. Avril Beckford is a well-known Pediatrician practicing in Atlanta and is Past President of the Georgia Chapter of the Academy of Pediatrics and prior District X (Southeast USA) member of the National Nominating Committee of the Academy of Pediatrics. She is currently the Chief Pediatric Officer of WellStar Health System and is a member of the WellStar Board of Trustees, WellStar Medical Group Executive Board and WellStar Clinical Partners. She has served on a number of other volunteer Boards, including that of The Lovett School, The National Council for Spiritual and Ethical Education and the Board of Camp Kudzu (a camp for children with Juvenile Diabetes) and the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta 1998 Society Board, and as Chair of the Cobb Area Pediatric Society. As a member of the Board of the Georgia Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, she has also served as the Chairperson of the Section on Families and Professionalism and as Chair of the Georgia Chapter AAP Foundation Board. She served on the board for SafePath Advocacy Center as well as the Boy Scouts of America and the Youth Protection Seminar that is held annually. Beckford is a member of the Alpha Omega

Alpha Honors Society and has held teaching position at Penn State University Children's Hospital. Beckford is the author of the parenting book: "Allow Your Children to Fail if You Want Them to Succeed." As well as the children's books: "I Love You 65 Bulldozers," and "The Tooth Fairy.' She has given talks internationally to parents, teachers and pediatricians. Beckford has previously written a chapter in a major Pediatric Textbook and has written other articles for Medical Journals, and parenting and teaching publications and has appeared as a guest on CNN, PBS and Channel 11 Live Atlanta broadcasts. Dr. Beckford was awarded the Hospital Hero Award from the Georgia Hospital Association in 2016.

Dr. Beckford is passionate about parenting and practicing pediatrics, with special interest in Early Childhood Brain Development and Emotional Intelligence.

She founded the Pediatric and Adolescent Center of Cobb with offices in Vinings and Austell and joined WellStar in 1995. She is married to Lawrence Rowley MD, an OB Gyn and they raised two wonderful sons, Justin and Derek.

Walquist then reminded all of our annual "Franklin Road Holidays Around the World" service opportunity on Friday, December 13th, 2019, 6 PM until 8 PM, at 877 Franklin Gateway, Suite 200. Our esteemed President then recognized new Rotarian **Jeff Couch** as officially "Blue Badged"; and, thereafter our President called for 'solar radiance' from our Club members.

Longtime Rotarian **Buck Northcutt** came forward to offer a poignantly gleaming reading from our awarding winning ROTALIGHT archives as penned by his Rotarian father, Guy Northcutt, then Associate Editor of our ROTALIGHT, on December 7th, 1951, related to Woodrow Wilson's arrival in Paris after World War I for the Paris Peace Conference. Moving and meaningful to be sure for our Veterans Day recognition gathering!

Other 'Sunshiners' included Rotarian Lee Pence radiating regarding an encounter in our local 'Krogers' with a MARIETTA READS student he had read to years ago'; Rotarian Joe Atkins glowed emittingly so with justified pride about his Army son receiving a noteworthy high honor and being in attendance (methinks brother Joe said, 'in New Mexico'(?)) when his son received the commendable U.S. Army commendation. Notwithstanding all of the above, President Chris then called on guest Boy Scout Logan Mossor to 'briefly' (ummmmm...) communicate information about his Eagle Scout Project involving purchases of handmade cards through "Operation Gratitude". Potential ES Mossor pontificated extendingly and enthusiastically about said project which offers much needed seasonal support to our brave service men and woman who are away from family and friends during the holidays. Good luck with your Eagle Scout project Logan!

Subsequently, before our President offered a concise, informative summary of the evolution of Veterans Day, he acknowledged Jim Peeler to read the highly emotive poem, "In Flanders Field". In prelude to the beautifully

done reading, Jim shared touching insights about his grandfather who served gallantly in World War II. After the well-done reading, President Elect Mary Ansley Southerland then came to the podium to introduce our Guest Speaker of the day, Jennifer Brett. Ms. Brett is a multiplatform Senior Journalist and Digital Coach at The Atlanta Journal-Constitution.

She is a North Carolina native and graduate of the University of North Carolina. Ms. Brett, titled her talk as, "Triumphs and Tragedies". She then shared captivating insight regarding her journalism career that included the "triumphant surprise" and overwhelming "viral popularity" of a retirement story of "a local Marietta U.S. Mailman, Mr. Marshall, who served as a mailman for 35 years." She claimed, "I still cannot believe the response to the retirement story" and, "will probably never do another story like this with this kind of response again." She heard from folks as far away as Japan, who bonded and resonated with the story. A media outlet in Japan actually sent a Production Team to make a movie of Postman Marshall who was, as we all will recollect, the Grand-Marshal of our Marietta 4th of July Parade. "I live in a great town, and a great story landed at the end of my driveway." Likewise, she spoke of the "tragedy" of one of her first assignments with the AJC which was the maniacal mass shooting that occurred on July 29th, 1999, in Buckhead when Mark Barton, a daytrader, killed 12 people, including his wife and children. This "grim assignment", stated Ms. Brett, "initiated a twentyyear journey that has spanned from Clinton to Trump". She has covered many "mass shootings" since that day in July in many states, and these are the "tragedies" in her career. "The tragedies are similar yet unique, all terrible in newly terrible ways. Each time I have been dispatched to a city convulsing in grief, it has been wrenching to talk with mourners, heartening to see communities band together and draining to see it keep happening." At the outset of covering these tragic moments, "the familiar 'hashtag'", according to Ms. Brett, was "never again". "But with the continuing re-occurrence of these mass shootings, as I reported from one chaotic scene after another...I've noticed they don't say 'never again' anymore."

In conclusion, our Guest Speaker commented, "I see increasingly and distressingly an 'ideological shift in truth'... "from biased perspectives"; "I am so glad to come home at the end of the day to my home off of Church Street and do a little gardening and visit with my neighbors...I am not political, I see solutions to our social problems in this room. Because of your commitment to 'Service Above Self', I believe our problems can be resolved with people living better lives." Consequently, restricted space here does not allow for additional remarks related to this EXCEPTIONAL Guest Speaker's journalistic career, challenging experiences, insights, and professional encounters. Nonetheless, a wonderfully done program offered by our commendable Guest Speaker!

Questions for our Speaker were presented from the floor as usual. Most touchingly, Dan Kirk stood to share a deeply personal insight related to Ms. Brett's assignment to cover the mass shooting aforementioned that took placed on July 29th, 1999 in Buckhead. Dan noted that his office then was "adjacent to where the July 29, 1999 shooting took place." "I woke up that morning with laryngitis and told my son, 'I don't think God wants me to go to work today". "Because I couldn't talk, I stayed home." ten minutes to three in the afternoon, someone called our home and without identifying herself, told my daughter, 'Just turn on the TV". "My daughter, age 15, turned on the TV and told me, 'Dad, there's been a shooting at your office in a day-trading firm". Dan noted that, "my secretary was the first to attend to the wounded. The shooter, Mark Barton, whom I had seen may times in the hall and the restroom, shot about 13 folks next to my office, then went across the street and shot about the same number at Piedmont Center. Ms. Brett today reminded me that 12 people died. At the time, that was the biggest massacre in Georgia since the Civil War." "My son who was 13 at the time asked me, 'Dad, what would you have done to that guy with your Marine Corps sword (which hangs on my office wall)'. I said, "Well, you don't bring a sword to a gunfight." Dan shared that, "I picked a good day to miss work." We are grateful Rotarians that God's providential care and grace prevailed that day in Dan's life.

Then our Opportunity Drawing ensued and this Scibbler did not take note of the Rotarians drawing, losing, or winning!?

Richard Cope was called upon to conclude our meeting with our traditional recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the U. S. Flag and unison acclamation of our Rotary Four-Way Test. President Chris then vigorously gaveled the bell and we were once again pronounced adjourned after a very commendable Rotary Club of Marietta Wednesday mid-week meeting.
