Today's Guest Speaker Spencer H. Gelernter, Ph.D.

Dr. Spencer Gelernter is a licensed clinical psychologist who is the Clinical Director of our multi-disciplinary clinic. Since 1993, he has directed a team of clinicians that provides a full spectrum of services, which include psychological testing for children and adolescents for various disorders, such as learning disabilities, ADHD, anxiety, and depression, as well as, psychotherapy for children, adolescents, adults, and families.

He is well known for working with troubled teens and their families, and both marital and family therapies are an integral part of his practice. Dr. Gelernter also works with individual adults who are addressing short-term life problems or long-term relationship/behavioral issues. Substance abuse, depression, anxiety, sexuality, and relationship issues are areas of his expertise. As a Clinical Psychologist, he is often asked to provide second-opinion consults for parents who want to better understand their child's recent Psychological Evaluation or want assistance in developing a treatment plan for their oppositional child.

In his professional capacity as a psychologist, Dr. Gelernter has directed numerous inpatient and outpatient programs. He has directed child day-treatment programs for severely disturbed children, an emergency response clinic for a mental health facility, a substance abuse awareness and prevention project, and an inpatient day-treatment program for children and adolescents. Dr Gelernter has served on the Board of Directors of more than a dozen non-profit organizations including five different schools, as well as, a number of leadership training organizations, and three terms on the Cobb County Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Gelernter helped design and initiate funding for the Cobb County School System Crisis Prevention and Intervention program. He also served as Vice-Chairman for the Cobb County Commissioners' Office Board of Ethics.

Dr. Gelernter is a native Atlantan who resides in Cobb County.
