Gill

After many years of working at all levels in the food service industry (and most recently as owner and operator of Barnstormers Grill), Trudy Gill made the step to join the John Maxwell Team as a member of his Advanced Leadership Certification Program. Trudy spoke about the revelations on leadership that she found in her studies in the certification program and shared several major points of leadership the Maxwell Team espouses. The process definitely challenged her own thoughts and beliefs about leadership. She asked everyone to consider several questions: How do you influence people about you? How do people see you? What is the real truth about your influence? To underscore this process, she asked everyone to participate in a brief exercise in which each individual

wrote down his/her own legacy on a sheet of paper. After folding the paper, it was passed about the table for others to write down positive comments on that person. At the end, Gill asked everyone to revisit their legacy with respect to the comments written by others. "Leadership is influence," she iterated. Gill spoke on three necessary ingredients in strong leadership. First, leadership is based on understanding. "Seek to understand before being understood," Gill added. Outstanding leaders will often provide creative means for all members of the team to reconnect and better understand each other's needs in the team environment. Second, Gill said there must be Necessary Endings for businesses, groups, organizations, and even individuals. She indicated that necessary endings can often rejuvenate and refocus energies in an organization. "Don't keep on doing things just because Johnny's granddad did it that way," she explained. And, finally, Integrity is the very foundation of trust upon which leadership is based.

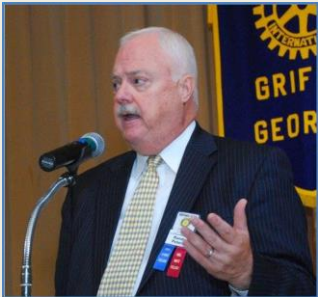
