

or value upon which he or she reflects and then composes the essay. "It is a personal essay," Underwood said. "They share their lives with you in those essays." Three of the grade winners then shared their wining essays with Rotarians and guests. First up was Jayme Angeles, the 9th grade and overall school winner, whose essay was based on never overestimating the power of self-confidence and optimism. In reflecting on her past, Jayme saw that she was very pessimistic in attempting to improve. She felt she was only a mediocre student and performer and that she relied upon a friend as her "crutch". But, she has worked to transform herself into being optimistic and positive in her studies and in her life. In turn, she met with successes which built self-confidence. Sierra Caraway, the 10th grade winner, built her theme on the African proverb, "It takes a village to raise a child." Sierra explained that her mother had really neglected her, all but rejected her, as a young child. The lack of that motherly influence was underscored on an elementary school trip to Jekyll Island when she saw how much the mothers of the girls in her cabin had done to help them to prepare for the overnight field trip. Realizing that void in her life at that moment was devastating. But, a teacher stepped in to be a confidant, to provide emotional support, and help. Even now, she confesses, there is pain, but she has learned that others in her "village" have filled that void with friendship, love, and support. And, Kendell Wilson, the 11th grade winner, wrote about Nelson Mandella's quote, "Once a person is determined to help themselves, they can achieve anything." Kendell experienced this as a young underclassman going out for the Griffin High football team. At first, he lacked the confidence to feel that he could even complete the conditioning and strengthening that was required. He almost quit. But, several members of the coaching staff offered words of encouragement, and upperclassmen supported him as he worked even harder. Now, Kendell provides that encouragement to younger players.
