# SHANNON ELLER OF BRIGHTER TOMORROWS CONSULTING SPEAKS

Shannon Eller, Clinical Director and owner of Brighter Tomorrows Consulting (BTC), explained that their counseling service is the largest private family practice south of I-285 in Georgia. BTC serves about 300 families each week for various needs including addictive behavior, anger management, and mental health issues. Located at 1850 North Expressway in Griffin, BTC will see almost every person who comes in for counseling. The only real exception is sex offenders who they cannot see because of the nature of the practice counseling many who have experienced traumatic events including sex offenses. A number of referral resources, including the courts system and DFACS, are linked to BTC from Spalding, Lamar, Upson, Butts, Henry, Clayton, and Fayette counties. The practice is staffed by 27 professionals. All counselors have at least Masters level postgraduate degrees, and all are licensed and certified with training in education and supervision. Eller noted that their patients have been as young as 2 years old and as old as 102. "It takes commitment from a family to seek and to remain in counseling services," she added. "We must meet them and their needs." In addition to providing highly qualified staff, BTC has added an outside classroom with a greenhouse, planters, bean bag targets, and other outdoor activities. They also have a music program and an art program that helps with diagnosis and treatment. BTC is addressing real needs in our community. Eller invited anyone to visit the facility.
