District 6900 Changes Lives of Mobility-Impaired Ugandans

The Rotary Club of Stone Mountain, led by Pres. Scott McEvoy, and the RC of Marietta, led by Pres. **Jesse Evans**, recently teamed to provide mobility equipment for physically disabled Ugandans via Dave Tolbert's Crutches 4 Africa—a humanitarian relief organization that has helped residents of 16 countries in Africa and 10 other countries worldwide.

Stone Mountain Rotarians collected over 3000 pieces of mobility gear including more than 1500 crutches, 1000 braces/pads, 360 walkers and 120 wheelchairs. These were temporarily stored in a local warehouse for Marietta Rotarian Richard Cope, Pres. of USA Cargo Services Co., to pack and ship to Uganda. Ben Worley, Dr. John Knox, Chuck Core, Dan Kirk, Walt Walker, and Past-Presidents Fred Beloin, The Honorable Reuben Green and Jim Kellogg, all from the RC of Marietta, worked in the warehouse for several weeks wrapping and securely packing everything into an ocean container that loads out for shipping on February 1st. Rotarians in Uganda conclude this life-changing Rotary outreach by unloading the container and handling the field distribution of its contents to citizens who at best crawl in the dust or depend upon being carried by others.





Mark Barbour noted the celebration of a new "birth" for our Club... we will soon welcome and charter yet another Rotary Club child, "The Brazil Atlanta Rotary Club"! All Rotary International criterion has recently been fulfilled for this group of entrepreneurial Brazilians to become a bonafide, certified, dignified, rectified Rotary Club of District 6900 as sponsored by The Club of Marietta (practically all of the Rotary Clubs in our area are our Club's 'babies'); Gratitude was then expressed by our President related to the outstanding participation in our Center for Family Resources Peanut Butter Collection Service Project. Gift cards and our collected jars of P'nut Butter were distributed to 756 families representing over 2,819 people with 1,770 of these folks being children! Well done Rotarians! Last but not least, President Jesse noted that Tranquility Hospice was the recipient of \$10,000 dollars given to come to aide of Veterans in respite care. This is in correlation with the "Because of the Brave" benevolence efforts as supported by Rotary Club President Elect Nominee Mary Ansley Southerland and community advocate Mark Maloney (is M.M. a Kiwanian?).

The Honorable Rotarian Amber Patterson was then called upon to introduce our Guest Speaker for the day. Judge Patterson noted that her serendipitous obligation to introduce our speaker of the day was related to 'she and he' both being graduates of the University of Florida. So with her admitted anemic affiliative association with Randolph Russell declared, she made a brief introduction and then stepped aside and American History Advocate, Author, widely traveled Saxophonist, former Financial Management Consultant, Investment Planner, and Rotarian Joe Atkins look-alike, Randolph G. Russell, came forth to proficiently pontificate about the disparaging disregard for and disconnection to our Nation's extraordinary history. In his opening remarks Mr. Russell noted that after the conclusion of the Constitutional Convention held in Philadelphia between May 27, 1787 - Sep 17, 1787, a woman came up to Benjamin Franklin and directed a terse question to him, "well Sir, do we have a Monarchy or a Republic?" To which Franklin replied, "a Republic if we can keep it". "The point being", according to Mr. Russell, "that we as a people are vastly uninformed about the process of how our government, our Republic, came into being; how it operates, and how do we ensure its perpetuity to operate with a population that is becoming more and more disengaged with the principles that brought our government into being...". Mr. Russell noted humorously (but sadly) that many America have very little interest or insight into American History. He made mention about 'on-the-street interviews' with citizens and some of the remarks made related to America History: Question - "Name the ships that Columbus sailed to American on..." - Answer - "the Ninja, the Pinacolata, and the Santa Anna Maria...". Likewise, only one out of one-thousand adults surveyed could name any of the freedoms guaranteed in U. S. Constitution, the Amendments to the Constitution, or the U.S. Bill of Rights. Our speaker did an excellent job of bringing to our attention that increasing disrespect and disdain for our heritage and the meaningful moments that made our Nation great is rampant... "there are amazing stories that give us a sense of divine intervention and destiny as a Nation..."; "stories we all should know and remember and celebrate to

sustain our Republic." Our speaker made several other remarks about monumental occurrences in our history and concluded his presentation with the words, "freedom is a choice...as we are losing our connection to our history we are losing our connection to a way of life and a way of government". Mr Russell's solution to the lack of respect for our history is found (and duly touted) in a book that he has authored, "American History in No Time"..."a Quick and Easy Read for the Basics of American History." This 121 page book, according to our speaker, "presents the foundational events of our American History in an easy-to-read and understandable format". Mr. Russell indeed passionately and persuasively preached the value of making U.S. History more enjoyable for and digestible by the upcoming generation... a noteworthy calling to be sure. After stirring-up the hearts and minds of attendees with the notion of "looking back gives us a better perspective of our world, how valuable past contributions have made us who we are and will help us become better citizens..."; Mr. Randolph Russell incited more emotive response by playing "America the Beautiful" on his saxophone... his jazz version of this patriotic song commanded a standing ovation from our Club members and guests upon conclusion.

Customary questions and commentary followed from those present and then Rotarians **Jeff Cooper** and Jess Loper, attempting to live down the incriminatingly insinuatingly corruptive memories of "(NO) Red Marble (in the bag) Gate" conducted our Opportunity Drawing 'as normally' as to be expected. Our Guest Speaker called out the ticket numbers and YES, both tickets drawn were held by longtime Rotarian and nonagenarian **Jim Trapnell.** But alas the red marble (*if there is really one in the bag...LOL*) could not be fingered!
